JOBS IN DEPTH The nonprofit sector directly employs 182,000, supports 54,000 jobs in business-to-business activity, and supports 26,000 jobs through household spending, 10 percent of all jobs.

Colorado's nonprofit sector employs more than the agriculture, mining, and information industries combined.


#### **COLORADO NONPROFITS' JOB GROWTH**

### ECONOMIC IMPACT GDP + JOBS






